

Simply Ballet Make-up Class Policy

We are proud to offer flexibility and service with our make-up class policy at Simply Ballet. Not all schools offer make-up classes and while we are happy to provide this option, it does come with some terms and conditions.

What is a ‘make-up class’?

- A ‘make-up class’ is where a student may attend a similar class to their regularly enrolled class as compensation for not being able to attend their regularly enrolled class.

Who is entitled to a ‘make-up class’?

- Students on an Open Division Month-to-Month (M2M) booking, or a Preschool or Graded Division Term booking are eligible for a make-up class if a regularly enrolled class is missed.

How and when can a ‘make-up class’ be used?

- Make-up classes may be taken at an alternate time or day to the student’s currently enrolled class, or an appropriate level as determined by Simply Ballet staff.
- Make-up classes cannot be used in lieu of a class a student is already enrolled in.
- A make-up class can only be used on a single class of equal or lesser length than the missed class.
- Where a make-up class is used to book a class of longer length, there may be an amount payable to cover the difference in class length.
- Make-up classes are subject to availability and must be used within 90 days of the missed class.
- If a make-up class is booked through the customer portal, and the student subsequently does not attend, a replacement make-up class will not automatically be issued. Students may apply in writing to office@simplyballet.com.au to have that make-up class rebooked.
- No refund, credit, or discounts will be given where a make-up class is not made use of.

- If a Month-to-Month or Term booking is cancelled or suspended, accrued make-up classes cannot be accessed.
- If a customer’s account has been suspended or has outstanding fees owing, use of make-up classes may be refused.

Example;

“Sally is on the month-to-month option at Simply Ballet, and is booked to attend the Level 1 class on a Tuesday night.

In June, Sally misses two of her normal Tuesday night classes because she is ill.

Sally then books two make-up classes on other days, one on a Thursday in June and then another on a Saturday in July - as both are within 90 days of the class she missed.

However, Sally cannot use her make up class as a replacement for the last Tuesday in June as that is the class she is regularly enrolled in.”
